What is compassion?

Being compassionate means not mistreating other people or animals, and helping them if they are suffering or hurt.

Compassionate people look out for others to make sure their lives are as happy and healthy as possible.









The needs of animals











1 Environment

Animals need a place where they can rest and sleep safely with plenty of space to move around and exercise.

Food and water

Just like humans, animals need the right diet. Animals need access to fresh clean water and the right type and amount of food to keep them fit and healthy.

3 Natural behaviour

Animals should be able to perform normal behaviour. Whether they like to run, jump, dig, fly or slither, they should have the space and environment to do just that!

4 Company

Some animals like company, and might even get lonely if left on their own. Other animals like to live alone, and so live independently in the wild and are kept on their own if a pet or farm animal.

5 Protection from harm

Animals should be protected from pain, suffering, injury and disease. Pets and farm animals need regular check ups from a vet. Wild animals need us to protect their habitats and to leave them alone as much as possible.

Pet dogs need:



Warm, dry bed

Access to fresh. clean water at all times Dogs eat meat but should not be fed human food

Dogs can get bored so need toys and chews to play with

Dogs can get lonely so they need friendly humans and dogs for company. They may be scared of dogs they don't know

Chocolate, onions, grapes and raisins are poisonous to dogs Dogs need vaccinating against diseases

Pet rabbits need:



Dry shelter, protected from wind and rain, with access to space to run around in plus a sandpit for digging in

Access to fresh. clean water at all times Mainly hay and leafy green vegetables with small pieces of carrot as a treat only

Rabbits like to dig, jump and run around They can be scared of dogs, cats and some birds

Rabbits should not be kept on their own and need to live with another friendly rabbit

Rabbits need vaccinating against diseases Rabbit's teeth grow fast so need to see the vet if they get very long







Animal needs

Farm hens need:



Enough space to move around freely and a safe secure hen house to keep foxes out! Access to fresh, clean water at all times

Hens need special chicken food for their age and the breed of hen

Hens like to dustbathe to keep clean and healthy so they need access to sand or dusty ground Hens like to perch at night

Hens should be kept with other hens If unwell, a hen may fluff up her feathers, be inactive and stay away from other hens

Wild badgers need:



Wild areas to build a 'sett' a network of tunnels and chambers underground Access to water in the wild, like a stream or puddle Hundreds of worms every night, fallen fruit and even birds' eggs when they can find them

Badger cubs like to play "tag" where they chase each other around
They like safe places to search for food so use the same places as their ancestors

Badgers are playful and like to live in family and friendship groups Pollution and litter hurt wild animals

Many badgers die in road accidents
